

Accessible Toilet

Purpose-built wheelchair accessible bathroom, with a clear pathway to access:

- Minimum door and aisle width of 850mm
- Maximum toilet height of 480mm width hand rails
- Minimum circulation space of 1600mm X 2000mm
- D Lever style handle



Accessible Entrance

- Flat entrance or permanent/portable ramp available
- Ramp is at least 1000mm wide
- Minimum door, aisle and lift width of 850mm

- Table height between 800—870mm
- Accessible pathway to table
- Customer service available outdoors

Assistance, Hearing and Guide Dog Etiquette



Assistance, Hearing and Guide Dogs can be of any breed and offer different support needs for people (medical alert, mobility, hearing, vision and emotional support)

When an Assistance, Hearing and Guide Dog is in a harness, it is working with the person so that they can move around safely and independently.

Whether it is walking, sitting or sleeping, the dog should not be:

- Patted without asking and receiving permission
- Fed
- Distracted talk to the person, not to the dog. Keeping pet dogs on leads in public places also helps Assistance Dogs to maintain their concentration.

These may all cause the Assistance, Hearing and Guide Dog to lose concentration, and put the person at risk.

The Assistance, Hearing and Guide Dog user has been trained in the most appropriate techniques for working or correcting the dog so only provide assistance if requested by the user. A person with a disability or mental health issue is entitled to be accompanied by an Assistance, Hearing and Guide Dog in public places and on public transport while they are genuinely using the animal for assistance.

People and their Assistance, Hearing and Guide Dog are legally* allowed to enter public places including:

- Shops, supermarkets, café's and restaurants
- Pubs, clubs, hotels and motels
- Hospitals
- All types of public transport, including taxis.
- The only exception is sterile environments eg. Surgery theatres

(Staff in charge of access to public places and transport are entitled to request reasonable proof and this can be in the form of certificate, paperwork and coloured vest)

"Text to speech" software can be activated on a tablet/iPad for FREE.

- 1. Launch "Settings" and tap on "General"
- 2. Scroll down to "Accessibility" and tap on "Speak Selection"
- Slide to "ON" and adjust the "Speaking Rate" 3. slider to an appropriate setting.
- 4. Adjust speaking rate—see picture
