Numurkah Levee Works - Update

The first section of the Numurkah levee is now complete, with final gravel works finished. The walking track is once again open and available for the community to enjoy.

Residents are reminded to remain cautious, as works are still continuing near the Moira Shire Council depot. Please follow all safety signage and observe any temporary closures in the area.

Approximately 5,000 cubic metres of treated topsoil were used in constructing this first section near the wetlands.

Works on the Kinnairds Road section of the earthen levee are nearing completion. Once this stage is finished, construction of the concrete levee structure in the same area will commence.

Stage B works are scheduled from 6 June to 30 July 2025 and will focus on the section between the railway line and Station Street, and from the Council Depot to Brenion Street.
