### 1. Executive Summary

The process of advertising the Proposed Budget and the consideration of submissions from interested persons is carried out in accordance with the Local Government Act 1989 (LGA), section 223. On 28 April 2014, Council resolved to place the Proposed Budget 2014/15 on public exhibition seeking comments on its content. As at the close of business on 4 June 2014 Council has received 183 written submissions (including 161 letters of support for Scott Reserve designs & one late submission received after the cut off time) with eight requests to be heard. This compares with 27 submissions received in the 2013/14 process.

As in prior years, those submitters, who have requested to be heard, have been invited to attend the meeting of Council and to speak to their submissions. No questions will be permitted.

It is suggested at this meeting, that Council refer its evaluation of each submission to the next ordinary meeting of Council, to be held on 23 June 2014.

### 2. Background and Options

The Proposed Budget 2014/15 was "prepared" in accordance with the Local Government Act on 28 April 2014. On 29 April 2014, Council publicly advertised its proposed budget and invited submissions to be lodged by 5pm on 4 June 2014.

In general, it is not considered prudent financial management to include expenditure items, which have not been considered subject to Council's prudent assessment process as part of the proposed budget. The assessment process ensures Council makes its decisions within the requirements of the LGA by, in particular, taking account of the long term effects and Council's long term plans and strategies.

Council's budget process has been in operation for several months, prior to Council preparing its Proposed Budget 2014/15, on 28 April 2014. Any requests outside of that process need to be weighed against those priorities already endorsed by Council in the proposed budget. Inclusion of any of these items needs to be at the replacement of current items residing in the proposed budget

#### BUDGET SUBMISSION - MOIRA SHIRE COUNCIL

#### 1 Introduction

#### 1.1 MHA CARE LIMITED

MHA Care Limited formally *Moira Health Alliance* was formed in 1998 by an agreement between the Moira Shire Council (MSC) and the Alliance. Home and Community Care (HACC) services were transferred from Council to the Alliance.

Council obtained the consent of the Minister of Local Government to enter into this agreement under section 186(5) of the *Local Government Act 1989* and the service agreement between Council and the Department of Human Services was amended to substitute the Alliance for Council.

The Cobram District Hospital, the Nathalia District Hospital, the Numurkah District Health Service and the Yarrawonga District Health Service all executed and delivered to Council a guarantee and indemnity to participate.

MHA Care Limited (MHA) is requesting a \$200,000 contribution from MSC towards Home and Community Care (HACC) services for the 2014-2015 financial year and \$32,000 towards the operation of Moira Food Share.

#### 1.2 HOME AND COMMUNITY CARE (HACC)

HACC services are designed to provide basic maintenance and support services to eligible people. HACC services are targeted to older and frail people with moderate, severe or profound disabilities and younger people with moderate and severe or profound disabilities and their unpaid carers.

A range of service types are provided in-home or in the community to support the person in their activities of daily living and community participation to assist them to stay as active and independent as possible.

Service types include Assessment, Domestic Assistance (Home Care), Linkages, Personal Care, Property Maintenance, Respite Care, Delivered Meals and Planned Activity Groups as well as clinical service types (such as Allied Health and District Nursing) and activities to build capacity of the service system.

Like most local councils across Victoria, MSC makes a significant financial contribution to HACC services.

MSC contributed \$266,000 towards HACC services for the 2013-2014 financial year.

National health and aged care reforms, including the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) and Living Longer Living Better will result in changes to HACC funding arrangements.

From July 2015, HACC services will be split on age, with services for people aged 65 and over directly managed by the Commonwealth Government and services for people aged under 65 will be funded and managed solely by the Victorian Government, until the NDIS is in full operation.

#### 1.3 COMMUNITY CARE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT

Victorian Councils have a statutory responsibility for health and wellbeing planning to address national health priorities, and the built and social environments for promoting health. This is demonstrated by councils investing in community care services and the fact that 73 of 79 councils in Victoria provide a range of HACC services.

According to the Municipal Association of Victoria in addition to HACC funding local governments overall own-source contribution is around 34 per cent of the total costs of providing a range of community support and care services for aged and disabled residents. This totalled over \$150.4 million in 201-11. Most of this relates to the HACC program, but the data does include councils' recurrent contribution to other government funded community care services, as well as Council-funded services.


The above figure excludes Victorian councils' extensive capital contribution and provision of local meeting places for social and recreational activities, and buildings for HACC service provision.

We believe MSC statutory obligations for health and well being planning are supported by an ongoing investment by MSC in the funding of home and community care.

#### 1.4 DEMOGRAPHICS OF THE MOIRA SHIRE

The MSC has an increasing ageing population going forward and over the next 20 years a significant increase in the 65 plus cohorts will result due to the spike from the so called baby boomers and the increasing migration of retirees.

According to the MSC Municipal Health and Well Being Plan 2013-16, the chart below gives an indication of the age structure for Moira in coming years.



#### 1.5 DEMAND FOR COMMUNITY CARE SERVICES

According to the Commonwealth Government recently released discussion paper on the key directions for the Commonwealth Home Support Programme (CHSP), by 2050 it is expected that over 3.5 million older people will access aged care services each year, with around 80 per cent delivered in the community.

HACC funding is based on a formula that takes into account the number of older people in the municipality adjusted to take account of socio-economic indicators. The increasing number of older persons in the Moira Shire is creating an unmet need for HACC services.

The Victorian Department of Health (Hume Region) provided data for the 2012-13 financial year which demonstrated that the HACC eligible population for the Moira Shire was estimated at 3,722 persons.

Currently MHA are providing services to a total of 1,159 persons. This volume represents 31.2% per cent of the HACC eligible population of the Shire.

MSC ongoing contributions to HACC service delivery will help MHA to fill the need for HACC services in the Shire above the funded levels provided by both the Commonwealth and State Governments.

#### 1.6 SERVICE DELIVERY

MHA received \$2,420,783 from the Victorian Department of Health (DOH) in approved HACC funding for 2013-14 financial year.

Service types include Access & Support, Allied Health, Assessment, Domestic Assistance (Home Care), Personal Care, Property Maintenance, Respite Care, Delivered Meals, Planned Activity Groups, Volunteer Co-ordination and activities to build capacity of the service system.

The majority of the funding is based on activity and under our service agreement with the DOH we are expected to achieve 95% of our targets to meet our contractual obligations.

For the 2012-13 financial year MHA achieved an overall target percentage of 102% for all service types. But it must be noted that for Delivered Meals, Domestic Assistance Personal Care and Respite the average percentage target achieved was 113%.

MSC contributions have allowed MHA to operate above our minimum targets set by the DOH which has a direct effect on the number of persons receiving home care in the shire.

### 1.6 SERVICE TARGETS AND FUNDING

The HACC program was created in 1984 and since 1998 unit pricing has been the method of funding delivery of service in Victoria.

MHA negotiates each financial year with the DOH the units of service that make up the overall funding provided. The Department also advises if there will be any growth funding forthcoming for the financial year.

The following table illustrates activity based targets and funding for the 2013-14 financial year

### 1.7 QUALITY OF SERVICE

It is a requirement of HACC funding that funded organisations meet the National Community Care Common Standards (CCCS). In December 2013 MHA was assessed as complying with all standards.

### 2 Moira Shire Council Funding

#### 2.1 BENCHMARKING COUNCIL FUNDING

MSC contributed \$266,000 towards HACC services for the 2013-2014 financial year which is equivalent to 16 per cent of the DOH funding contribution across all activity funding service types.

Contribution by local government is variable across Victoria. It has been estimated by the Municipal Association of Victoria to range from 17 to 25 per cent above the HACC output price.

#### 2.2 USE OF COUNCIL FACILITIES

Included in the funding for activities to build capacity for the financial year 2013-14 was an amount of \$27,780 which was distributed to the Senior Citizens Clubs across the Shire as a contribution to the maintenance of Council owned buildings were MHA provided services at the premises.

In previous years the HACC building maintenance grant was also distributed to senior citizens clubs where MHA did not run services.

All other Council owned buildings where MHA runs services (with the exception of Killara House in Cobram) are hired on a seasonal or one off user basis by MHA.

Currently a lease is under negotiation with MSC Officers for the use of Killara House by  $\mbox{\scriptsize MHA}.$ 

It is also anticipated that once MSC has reached agreement with the various Senior Citizens Clubs across the Shire with regard to occupancy, MHA will negotiate with those clubs for access to run Planned Activity Groups at their centres. These agreements are necessary to enable the senior citizens clubs to continue to receive the building maintenance grant monies.

#### 2.3 AGREEMENT

It is acknowledged by MHA the current lack of an agreement with an agreed funding formula and conditions for Council's contribution to HACC services provides uncertainty to both MHA and MSC. The current arrangement provides a challenge to MHA in terms of accurate budgeting to underpin service delivery and uncertainty for MSC in relation to its annual budget commitment when tasked with competing demands on the shire rate base.

Therefore an agreement between MSC and MHA needs to be negotiated to reflect the unique partnership that exists for the benefit of the residents of Moira Shire who are eligible for HACC services.

MHA believes the basis of the agreement should reflect the extra services that will be delivered as a condition of the MSC yearly contribution.

MHA believes the funding should be applied across the following activity based service types.

If we apply the above percentage of activity based service types across a MSC contribution of \$200,000 the table below reflects the extra meals and hours of service that will help MHA to fill the need for HACC services in the Shire above the funded levels provided by both the Commonwealth and State Governments. Unit pricing is based on the 2013-14 financial year.

The overriding intent is to formalise the current collaborative and co-operative working agreement that ensures HACC services are delivered as effectively and efficiently as possible across the municipality.

MSC may require Victorian State Government approval to allow MSC to step outside of the normal tendering arrangements because of the unique nature of the agreement when negotiating with MHA.

### 2.4 MOIRA FOODSHARE

MHA Care Limited (MHA) is requesting a \$32,000 contribution from MSC towards the operation of Moira Food Share for the 2014-2015 financial year. This will maintain the existing level MSC contribution. It must be noted however that this contribution has decreased from \$38,500 in the 2010 – 2011 financial year.

Moira foodshare distributed over 200,000 meal equivalents throughout the shire over the last twelve months. This equates to approximately \$2.5 million dollars worth of food.

### 3 Conclusion

Maintaining a viable service today across a large geographical area and an ageing shire is a significant challenge. But with certainty over council funding (HACC Services) for a negotiated term MHA will be better equipped to meet these challenges.

The negotiated agreement will also provide certainty for MSC in outlining its responsibilities to the provision of aged and disability services to the shire with funding directed towards increased service quantity and service enhancement for shire residents.

Dear Councilors and CEO of Moira Shire Council,

This email has reference to the proposed Moira Shire proposed budget 2014-2015 posted on the Moira Shire Council website. I am writing to you not only as a concerned former public employee and on behalf of my family who are rate payers in the Shire but also in the best interests of yourselves as representatives of the Moira Shire Community and the Moira Shire Community at large.

As you know, that "a budget not only reflects the character of the council, but is also a crucial underlying fundamental that will determine future prosperity and livability of the shire. You get this wrong and our future is in jeopardy. Hence, I attach a full fledged analysis of the proposed budgets based on figures presented in the budget document that has been presented to the community. The sole purpose of me doing this is to draw your attention to some items that warrant your serious attention and consideration to address the precarious financial situation. I ask you to keep your eye on the highlighted figures & percentages on page 5 of the attached. May I respectfully stated at the onset that this is in no way intended to malign or prejudice any analysis that may already be provided to you by the council officers.

As a preamble to you going through the attached presentation, may I draw your undivided attention to a few highlights.

#### Rates:

Last year, it was commendable on you that you considered the community's "capacity to pay" and that "you heard the community" and fought hard to reduce the rates+charges from 6% to 3.5% that strategically forced the Council to look inwards be more prudent in their expenditure and cut waste.

Unfortunately, you have now proposed a 9.55% increase in rates+charges for 2014-2015 that will absolutely push the community, particularly many in our community that live paycheck-to-paycheck. As you are aware, that we as Australians are right now reeling if not trying to grapple with the proposed Federal medicare co-payments, debt levy tax, increased fuel excise and even more distressing to us, is the looming increase in <u>G.ST</u>. To add salt to our wounds, the current economic downturn in the farming industry and bleak financial stability and unemployment has created immense stress and angst in the community. I ask you to ponder on this and with conviction decide whether the "community has the capacity to pay" this unwarranted rate rise. I say this because I see that Council has not gone far enough in curtailing three of their biggest costs namely Salaries & Wages, External Contractors and Material & Services which they had assured the community at last year's budget sessions.

Even more disconcerting is that Moira Shire's communication not only in recent weeks in the Yarrawonga Chronicle but also at the community budgets sessions has been that the rates are going up by 5.5% and charges 3.5% when in fact, the rates+charges were going up 9.55%. I leave this to your conscience and good judgement whether this is very deceiving or not to the public.

### Anomalies and Sustainability:

judgement is that there are several untruths being told and numerous anomalies in the budget figures that poses serious questions about Council's ability of prudential and open budgeting and financial management expertise across the board and this I believe is an offense to us as a community who trust Council to do the right thing by the people in the Moira Shire community.

#### The Key concerns:

- <u>Liquidity</u>. Council will have only 77 cents of current assets to pay \$1 of current liabilities, rendering
  them insolvent, even more disconcerting is a statement at the 6.00 pm Yarrawong budget session
  that Moira shouldn't shy away from borrowing more money.
- The financial sustainability ratio for 2014-2015 has worsened by 26% over 2013-2014 coupled with a three year on year deficit and decrease in cash balances by a whopping 36% over 2013-2014 rendering Council financially unstable, yet at the budget sessions we were told that councils finances are in a healthy position.
- Deteriorating year end cash balances. Cash balances have worsened by 36% where Council may not be able to meet its obligations by the end of the year. The cash burn rate on Operating activities for this year is \$292k per month and next year will be \$617k per month which is almost 111% greater than the current year. Given rates revenue and grants is staggered, this will mean that Moira will run out of cash by \$(900k) by March 2015. (This also assuming that rates collection is excellent & grants are true and timely).
- Numerous financial anomalies in the budget document. How then are to rely on the veracity of the financials produced.

Yes, Moira Shire Council's welfare indeed rests in your hands and I am confident that your empathy and leadership in heeding to these concerns and taking control of the financial situation will be remembered and revered by us as a community.

You see how this only helps with making the cash balance and deficits look good on paper?

First off, if you are actually reading this submission, please accept my thanks and appreciation.

Next, whenever asked to comment on a set of numbers, be it these or any other, a favourite saying often comes to mind, "figures can lie and liars can figure". In this instance, the figures that are lying (at the very least, severely bending the truth) are the ones supplied by Council in this 2014-15 proposed budget.

So how are these figures lying? Because my annual rate notice from last year — the one sent to me for payment - was based on the 2013-14 ADOPTED BUDGET (I still have the letter from ex-Mayor B Keenan to prove this) — not the "revised" 2013-14 Forecast (see Column A, page 5, of the accompanying attachment).

Which means, if trying to estimate / to compare last year's rate notice with the one heading my way very soon, the correct column of numbers to use for comparison purposes is Column B over C (again, refer to page 5 of the accompanying attachment).

Which means Council's comparison of the 2014-15 proposed budget (Column B) with the "revised" 2013-14 Forecast (Column A) <u>severely downplays and glosses over</u> the true impact of this year's proposed budget compared to last year's adopted budget — the one used to generate last year's rates notices!

When the correct calculation is carried out, this year's proposed budget divided by last year's adopted budget. Moira Shire residents are staring down the barrel of a Rates + User Charges increase of 9.2% ((31.55 + 2.84) / (28.81 + 2.69)). This being much greater than the misleading figure of 5.5% currently reported in the local newspapers by Council.

Regretfully, as stated above, "figures can lie and liars can figure", and Moira Shire Council has certainly demonstrated a proficient capacity in recent years of deflecting Moira Shire residents' attention away from the real truth (in my opinion, of course).

Finally, and this being the really sad conclusion, once residents of Moira Shire take the time to review the remainder of the numbers contained in the accompanying attachment, (ie,

Re: 2014/2015 Moira Shire Proposed Budget

I express serious concern at the omission of any reference, or inclusion of any expenditure, within the Moira Shire 2014/2015 Proposed Budget, towards the construction of a required levee bank to the east of Cobram as designed and necessary to stop flood waters overtopping at Dicks Levee from flowing into the town of Cobram.

Under the Capital Expenditure Plan the 2012/13 and 2013/14 Moira Shire Proposed Budgets both noted the "Levee Bank, Cobram" as "Construction of levee bank across the Murray Valley Hwy, east of Cobram. Works include construction of a permanent levee and purchase of demountable barriers for the highway crossing".

Proposed funding under those budgets was detailed as follows-

#### 2012/13 Proposed Budget

Year 2012/13 Nil

Year 2013/14 Budget \$705,000 External grant funding \$660,000 Shire \$45,000 Year 2014/15 Budget \$295,000 Shire \$295,000

#### 2013/14 Proposed Budget

Year 2013/14 Nil

Year 2014/15 Budget \$300,000 External grant funding \$200,000 Shire \$100,000 Year 2015/16 Budget \$750,000 External grant funding \$550,000 Shire \$200,000

Reference to the construction of the required levee in proposed capital works, and any allocation of funding for the project, have been omitted from the 2014/15 Moira Shire Proposed Budget, and budget projections for following years. No obvious evidence exists that any works have commenced on the project.

The Camp Scott Furphy Pty Ltd - Cobram Town Levees Study - Final Design Report October 1993 noted the importance of this levee in the overall flood protection plan for the township of Cobram. The report included detailed construction design, and location information for the levee.

Dicks Levee forms part of the Cobram Town Levee Protection system and was designed to overtop but not breach in a 1:100 year flood event. The proposed (and not erected) intercepting levee – locally commonly referred to as the "Collie Levee" - is designed to run from high sand hill country west of Pye Road and south across open land to the Murray Valley Highway to lock into the GMW channel bank (plan enclosed). Temporary sandbagging of the actual highway in a flood event was envisaged in the concept plan for the levee. It was designed to intercept overtopping floodwater from Dicks Levee and to divert that water in a southerly direction to eliminate flooding risk to the town of Cobram

The 1998 Moira Shire Flood Plan Report (page 18) noted that "in a 1% flood, with Dicks Levee set at the 1975 level and an overtopping but not breaching scenario, it is expected that about 340 m3/scc (29000 ml/day) would escape from the river at that location". Of this the report further states that at the highest conceivable level which could be reached at the "Collie Levee" vicinity an estimated 5000 megalitres of water per day would be moving towards.

Later catchment documentation actually refers to Dicks Levee as Dicks Weir. If Dicks Levee was to not overtop, but actually breach, the resulting flood from that location could be of a far greater magnitude.

Cobram presently has 1:100 year flood levee protection commencing downstream from Dicks Levee and terminating in the vicinity of Racecourse Road Cobram. This provides protection to immediate flooding adjacent to the town but does not safeguard against possible flooding from Dicks Levee. Both the 1993 Camp Scott Furphy Report and the 1998 Moira Shire Flood Plan Report emphasize the importance of safeguarding Cobram from floodwaters flowing from Dicks Levee by the erection of an intercepting levee ("Collie Levee").

Various meetings have taken place over the past 20 years relating to the need to address the serious "Collie Levee" issue. Words have been spoken, undertakings given, actions proposed and budgeted funds allocated. Nothing has happened.

Approximately three years ago I attended a meeting held at Moira Shire Cobram Office, which in part addressed the problem of flooding risk to Cobram from Murray River floodwaters overtopping or escaping from Dicks Levee. The meeting was attended by councillors and officers from both Moira and Berrigan Shires, officer representatives of the SES and CMA and other river authorities, together with local people with background knowledge of the flooding risk associated with the incomplete town levee system.

The meeting agreed that Murray River levee protection at Cobram was scriously compromised by the lack of the "Collic Levee" and that the matter should be rectified without further delay.

I hold copies of the Camp Scott Furphy and Moira Shire Flood Plan reports if any councillor or officer wishes to verify concerns within the reports relating to the need for the "Collie" protection levee.

I strongly recommend that funding for the necessary "Collie" levee be reinstated in the 2014/2015 Moira Shire Budget, and if necessary in budgets for following years, and that the Shire treat as urgent the erection of the "Collie Levee" to ensure the completion of the 1:100 year flood protection for Cobram residents and their homes, businesses and industries.

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

#### Submission Re: Proposed 2014/2015 Budget

In this submission, reference is made to the Moira Shire 2014/2015 Proposed Budget and, in particular, to Appendix 6 Fees and Charges Schedule and to the Proposed Capital and Major Maintenance Budget 2014/15.

It is noted that, in the Proposed Capital and Major Maintenance Budget 2014/15 under the sub-heading OTHER, it is proposed that some \$700,000 is to be spent over the next two years on the Yarrawonga aerodrome for widening of taxiways and upgrading of the runway. This is additional to various runway lengthening and widening and upgrading works together with the construction of a terminal building, which have taken place over the last few years.

Recent capital expenditure on Yarrawonga Aerodrome must now number in the millions of dollars and seems to be a continual drain on the Shire's finances.

It is also noted that, in Appendix 6 Fees and Charges Schedule, no fees and charges are scheduled for use of the aerodrome at Yarrawonga. However, fees and charges are scheduled for use of other public assets, for example, the hire of the Yarrawonga Town Hall and Cobram Civic Centre Hall.

It seems entirely appropriate that some form of user pays fee structure should be introduced to return revenue to the Council's budget from operations at Yarrawonga aerodrome. Apparently, there are an average of over 1000 movements per month on the Yarrawonga aerodrome and it is expected that a valuable revenue stream could be developed with a view to recovery of at least some of the considerable public funds spent on the aerodrome to date.

Such revenue sources are likely to become increasingly important in the current economic climate as more cost shifting is introduced by federal and state governments and grants become more difficult to secure.

It is evident that, if the Council is seeking financial sustainability, revenue streams, other than rates, need to be investigated and implemented. In this respect, continual rate increases of the order of 5% to 6% are not sustainable, certainly from a ratepayer's point of view and they are, in fact, inflationary. At 6% per annum increase, rates will double in 12 years, which is a daunting prospect for many Moira residents.

I trust that this submission will receive your earnest consideration but decline the opportunity to speak to the submission at the special meeting of Council.

- Built links and working relationships with health professionals, aged care residents, environmental organisations as well as with a wide range of community groups
- Provided a venue and encouragement for "healing" exhibitions helping people to come to terms with their experiences during recent natural disasters - 2012 Flood, 2014 Fires.
- Helped shire artists to more widely have their work displayed, such as the Olivia Newton John Wellness Centre in Melbourne.
- Developed international links with organisations and artists and held pop up exhibitions of regional artists work in many places in the world, such as Jordan, London, Hortonnes in France and Belfast N. Ireland.

We have achieved all of this in quite a short space of time and without any significant government funding, thanks to the help and positive support we have received from The Nathalia Community Bank, The Sidney Myer Fund, La Trobe University Bendigo and others.

We are often ineligible to apply for many Arts grants, Community Development Grants and State and Federal Government grants because we have no demonstrated support from Local Government.

We sincerely hope that Councillors will consider redressing this issue, so that we can continue to expand our programs and ability to provide a vibrant, positive arts facility for the Moira Shire and be able to then apply for other State, Federal and Arts funding, because we can demonstrate Local Government support for The G.R.A.I.N. Store.



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
