MOIRA SHIRE COUNCIL PROPOSED BUDGET 2015/16 - SUBMISSIONS

1. Executive Summary

The process of advertising the Proposed Budget and the consideration of submissions from interested persons is carried out in accordance with the Local Government Act 1989 (LGA), section 223. On 27 April 2015, Council resolved to place the Proposed Budget 2015/16 on public exhibition seeking comments on its content. At the close of business on 29 May 2015, Council has received 16 written submissions with 11 requests to be heard. This compares with 183 submissions (including 161 letters of support for Scott Reserve designs) received in the 2014/15 process.

As in prior years, those submitters who have requested to be heard have been invited to attend the meeting of Council and to speak in support of their submissions. No questions will be permitted.

It is suggested that Council refer its evaluation of each submission to the next ordinary meeting of Council, to be held on 22 June 2015.

2. Background and Options

On 28 April 2015, Council publicly advertised its proposed budget and invited submissions to be lodged by 5pm on 29 May 2015.

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

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

Submission:	Following submission in June 2014 by our group, Council allocated \$15,000 to be used for investigation into the development of a walk/cycle track proposed to run the length of Hogans Road from the Murray Valley Highway to the Boat Ramp in the 2014/2015 financial year. Despite written request to shire in February 2015 requesting a progress update of how these funds have been used, we were told this was confidential and have received no further information. We have since been advised these funds have not been used. The proposed budget for 2015/2016 indicates funds have been allocated for construction of a temporary path from the Murray Valley Highway to Rosemary Court. This is a distance of approximately 0.5km of a road that is 1.5kms in length. It is the view of the action group, that whilst any progress is welcome, it does not mitigate the significant road safety concerns, expressed previously. We therefore make our submission that the council should include in the 2015/2016 budget sufficient funds to construct a track which runs the full length from the Murray Valley Highway to the boat tamp. This will ensure that vehicular traffic and pedestrians/cyclists will be separated and therefore reduces the risk of accident and serious injury. Lake Rowan community is pleased to see that \$185,000 has been allocated to the Urban Dust Suppression Program — Provision of urban dust suppression seal, of which Lake Rowan has been identified to benefit from this project. The project will focus on:

Holmes Rd, Lake Rowan (Lake Rowan Rd to Benalla-Yarrawonga Rd)

Holmes Rd, Lake Rowan (Benalla-Yarrawonga Rd to Savage St)

Savage St, Lake Rowan (Holmes Rd to Christian Rd)

The Lake Rowan community has been waiting a long time for this project.

Community members recently met with Council officers from the Operations department to plan for the project. Discussions on the works to be undertaken on the project were endorsed by the Officers and the community members present at the meeting.

The current issues associated with the above roads not being sealed include:

- The roads are bus routes and stops for school buses
- There is concern around safety of cars at the road junctions
- Lake Rowan does not have town water therefore, with the road dust, property rain water is contaminated
- Dust on properties requires properties to have windows closed and hung laundry to be dirty;

- The B double grain trucks and farm equipment use the roads this causes extreme dust to properties

This issue has been in Lake Rowan's Community Action Agenda (Plan) for many years; it has also previously been identified on Council's draft budgets, but not yet successful.

Moira Shire 2015 - 2016 Budget Submission by the Strathmenton Community Coordinators

The Strathmerton Community Coordinator group wishes to honour the memory of a great Australian Sir Murray Bourchier by establishing a memorial plantation dedicated to his memory on the North side of the Murray Valley Highway from Kenny Street to Macguire Street and Butt Street to the highway exit. We want to do this to recognize the ongoing connection of Sir Murray and the Bourchier family to the Strathmerton district with the family farm "Woodland Park" still held by family members, and to also honour this important historical figure and provide a substantial streetscape improvement for Strathmerton.

At this stage we intend to install four laser cut images of Sir Murray Bourchier representing four stages of his life as a farmer, soldier, politician and advocate for ex-servicemen, farmers and their families together with four podium style signs detailing his life's work. The images and signs will bookend two plantations of probably Pyrus Calleryana Chanticleer although all this will depend on community support and feedback.

The Strathmerton Coordinators as they are a non-incorporated advisory group cannot fundraise for this project but have community partners such as Lions to join with them to help progress this important project. The Strathmerton Community Coordinators intend to apply for a Victorian Veterans Council Anzac Centenary Grant supporting the establishment of new memorials using Lions to auspise the grant and to also support some community fundraising. I am here tonight to bring this to your attention and to ask for your consideration in supporting this important project for Strathmerton. Council was approached to include this in its 2015/16 Budget at no nett cost to Council but this has not occurred ,we ask that Council reconsider this decision and include this project as an externally funded item in the Budget.

Below is a biography of Sir Murray Bourchier detailing his outstanding service to his country.

Sir Murray William James Bourchier (1881-1937), grazier, soldier and politician, was born on 4. April 1881 at Pootilla, Bungaree, Victoria, eldest son of Edward Bourchier, Geelong-born farmer, and his wife Francis (Fanny), née Cope. In 1878 Edward and his three brothers had taken up four adjoining selections on the Murray River near Tocumwal. Within a few years their properties had expanded considerably: Edward's, near Strathmerton was called Woodland Park; the other three were known collectively as Boomagong. After a private education in Melbourne, Murray returned to Woodland Park. From 1909 until the outbreak of World War I he commanded a troop of light horse at Numurkah, attending annual camps and courses.

Bourehier's military service was distinguished. He enlisted in the Australian Imperial Force in August 1914 and sailed as a lieutenant in the 4th Light Horse Regiment, serving seven months on Gallipoli. After the Sinai campaign in 1916-17, during which he was promoted lieutenant-colonel commanding his regiment, he made the crucial final assault on Beersheba. On 31 October 1917 he led his men, many of them from his own district, at full gallop over two miles into Turkish entrenchments and on for a further two miles (3,2 km) into Beersheba to capture vital wells before the Turks could destroy them. Lacking sabres, the regiment used bayonets held in their hands as shock weapons. For this exploit he was awarded the Distinguished Service Order and earned the sobriquet 'Bourchier of Beersheba'. Eleven months later, after fighting north through Palestine, he commanded a joint force of the 4th and 12th Light Horse regiments (Bourchier Force) in the final advance on Damascus; on entering the city the 4th captured 12,000 Turks and set about relieving their sufferings.

Bourchier was three times mentioned in dispatches. He was appointed C.M.G. in June 1919 and his A.I.F. appointment ended in October. In 1921 he was promoted colonel, commanding the 5th Cavalry Brigade, and in 1931 brigadier, in charge of the 2nd Cavalry Division. He returned to Strathmerton but later farmed a property at Katandra, which he named Kuneitra. On 16 June 1921 at Holy Trinity Church, Kew, he married Minona Francis, daughter of Sir Frank Madden.

In 1920 Bourchier entered the Legislative Assembly as the Victorian Farmers' Union member for Goulburn Valley; he had to contest the 1921 election but between 1924 and 1935 he was unopposed as Country Party member. The plight of returned soldiers had been his active concern; fittingly, his maiden speech was an attack on the (Sir) Harry Lawson government's neglect of ex-servicemen and the subject remained a constant theme. He was fiercely loyal to his electorate and its particular rural interests. He allied himself with the conservative John Allan against (Sir) Albert Dunstan's breakaway group of 1926, the Country Progressive Party. Bourchier would not tolerate the notion of an alliance with Labour, which Dunstan favoured. He opposed the unemployed workers' insurance bill of 1928 on the conflicting grounds that there would always be the 'unemployable' in the community and that lack of work was a temporary problem: he considered the money would be better spent on national under-takings, such as irrigation schemes. Similarly in 1931, he opposed the unemployment relief bill, because it discriminated against the unemployed in country areas. He was typical of the aggressive parochialism of his party.

Bourchier was minister of agriculture and of markets in the Allan government in 1924-27 and deputy leader of the party in 1927-30. When the party and the breakaway group amalgamated to form the United Country Party in 1930 he was obliged to stand down for Dunstan. Bourchier was not one of those approved by Sir Stauley Argyle to Join his United Australia Party-Country Party coalition from May 1932. Next year, when Allan had to resign after a revolt by three members, Bourchier won the leadership ballot which followed. He was a principled and predictable man, who never lacked a solid bloc of supporters, but he was an uninspired leader, and he seemed almost destined to lose in the end to the more resourceful Dunstan. His March 1935 election campaign was unimpressive; be concentrated almost entirely on rural matters in the general context of sound finance, a balanced budget, and no additional taxation. Although the party improved its position, his supporters grew impatient. On 14 March, at a meeting over which Bourchier presided, his leadership was challenged: Dunstan won by 13 votes to 11. In the Country Party government formed with Labour support on 2 April, Bourchier was named chief secretary and minister of labour and deputy premier.

In January 1936 his appointment as agent-general in London

With reference to the Moira Shire Council Proposed 2015/16 Budget. The above committee would like the following submission considered for inclusion in your 2015/16 budget.

THE YARROWEYAH TOWN DRAINAGE PLAN.

Over the past years we have tried to have the drainage problem at Yarroweyah rectified without any progress being made. Recently we made some ground when a survey was undertaken by the Shire with a plan to drain the excess water after heavy rains to a drainage pond on the west side of Yarroweyah. This was to be completed in two stages.

A meeting was ask for by the Committee with Graham Henderson (Manager, Construction and Assets) and Brett Hay to discuss the way the Shire was going to complete this work with the view of changing the stages around. At this Meeting we were informed that a Title search had been conducted re: easement but found that the easement from the highway was never formally created. An easement will need to be formally created and is expected the cost to be at an upper limit of \$10,000 allowing for a licensed surveyor, preparing a new title plan showing the easement, lodgement of the revised title plan at the Titles Office, any legal fees and any compensation to the affected landowner that the easement will be created on their land. There would also need to be an additional survey done along Kenny road.

We as a committee feel that the drainage problem in Yarroweyah has been overlooked for too long. The problem of water lying around the area between Gooley Street and Kenny road along the highway and in front of Yarroweyah Engineering old factory is not improving and will not improve until the Shire does something about the drainage.

We as residents of Yarroweyah pay rates the same as residents in the major towns in the Shire and feel that some of these rates should be used to pay for projects like the Yarroweyah Town Drainage Plan. We feel that the Yarroweyah Town Drainage Plan should be included in the Moira Shire Council Proposed 2015/16 Budget.

Response to the Moira Shire Draft Council Plan 2013-2017.

Thank you for the opportunity to contribute my opinion of the proposed Draft Council Plan 2013-2017, Partnership, Growth and Liveability. I have read the document very carefully. I believe that there are important health and wellbeing issues that relate to partnerships, growth and so-called "liveability" that need to be fully considered for incorporation into the Council Plan.

What is "liveability?

Firstly, there is no definition of so-called "liveability" in the draft document. Secondly, there no explanation of what the Shire intends so-called "liveability" to mean or encompass. Thirdly, although your strategic goal is to provide "a better mix of services and programs" (page 8), the well established and fully documented role that the arts and culture can play in strengthening and maintaining the emotional health and wellbeing of the community (Cohen, G. 2006; Hanna, G & Perlstein, S. 2008; Mental. Health Foundation, UK. 2011; National Endowment for the Arts, USA. 2013; Schmid, T. 2005; VicHealth. 2002), would not appear to have been considered in the draft plan.

The Moira Art and Culture Inc.

The Moira Shire should be congratulated for recently establishing Moira Arts and Culture Inc. (MAC Inc.). Since its inception MAC Inc. has already established a track record of providing well-attended programs and activities that "connect communities". Future MAC Inc. arts and cultural

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projects could and should be designed to "encourage healthy and active communities".

The health and wellbeing needs of Moira Shire residents

The health and wellbeing of individuals living in Moira Shire is a priority and the creative arts are a rich untapped resource. The Moira Shire owes ratepayers a responsibility to maximize all available arts research knowledge and arts funding opportunities to help it achieve its stated goals and strategic performance indicators. The MAC Inc. infrastructure is set up to assist the Shire in its application for significant state and federal health and the arts funding grants.

A commitment to health and inclusive and connected communities

The Mayor and the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) state that they have a "commitment to the health" of Moira Shire, and that "health services are an important sector" (page 2). But, the omission of the important role that the creative arts can play in healthcare service provision means that the Draft Council Plan misses out on golden opportunities to inexpensively "support inclusive and connected communities".

As a gerontologist, and a dementia-specific program designer, with a long track record of delivering professional services to aged care in Australia and overseas, I propose to make one or two statements. I request that the Mayor and CEO consider the following statements when formulating the final and future policy documents.

2016 marks the year that first of the baby boomer generation, born between 1946 and 1960, turns seventy. 2016 is also the year when an Access Economics report prepared for Alzheimer's Australia (2005) predicts that dementia will become the biggest disability burden in Australia's history. Moira Council figures (page 2) indicate that the baby boomer generation and

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their parent's generation, at 21.6%, already make up almost a quarter of the Moira Shire population. In the introduction the Shire claims that this ageing cohort is "relatively small", and "slower growing". In fact, the Alzheimer's Australia (2005) research report mentioned above indicates that the health care needs of the retired baby boomer generation will not be small, nor will it be slow growing in any Shire in Victoria, over the next decade.

Moira Shire and the healthcare impact of the baby boomers

The baby boomer generation will live longer than any other generation in history. As a result, they will require and consume more health resources. In an attempt to contain these healthcare costs, in the near future, almost all regional, state and national funding will be related to quality of life and community health and wellbeing. And, almost all funding grants will be linked in some way to the quality of life of residents living in "dementia friendly" communities. The importance of forward planning to address this very real and looming health care crisis is imperative. Planning for the delivery of a "smarter" health service to a rapidly increasing number of ageing Moira Shire residents and those living with dementia and other disabilities is already a top priority. Consideration of "dementia friendly" communities, should at the very least, be acknowledged in your current draft plan and linked to future arts programming.

Addressing the health and wellbeing needs of a "dispersed" population

In addition, health care service delivery costs will not necessarily be dependant on the age of existing infrastructure or how dispersed the population may be. Whether Moira Shire's health service delivery model will be "more expensive" than any other Council, is both relative and dependent on a number of unknown factors that cannot be accurately predicted at this time. International studies, conducted in the USA and the UK (mentioned above) have shown that best practice service delivery is inextricably linked,

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not only to the foundation of solid partnerships, but also to the establishment of progressive arts programming.

I have read the Moira Shire 2010-2013 Municipal Public Health and Wellbeing document. This document makes no mention of the beneficial and positive public health and wellbeing outcomes that are the result of participatory involvement in the arts. Nor does it acknowledge the role those arts programs can play in developing and growing community connectedness.

I advocate for the development and implementation of well-designed intergenerational arts and cultural programming. The adoption of such a strategy will prove to be both a practical and cost effective way to address the future health and wellbeing needs of young and old Moira residents alike.

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
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Response to the Moira Shire Draft Council Plan 2013 -2017

Moira Arts and Culture Inc Board felt a response to the Draft Council Plan document was necessary as there is a distinct lack of identification throughout the entire document to the role which culture and cultural tourism play in the livability, competitiveness, and health and wellbeing of a community. As a major arts and culture advocacy board for arts and cultural development across Moira communities it was felt it was our duty to bring this anomaly to the attention of the Council.

We would like to present our response to the Council at an appointed time.

Before reading the response it is important to define the word "Culture", and for this response the following definition was used.

Definition of Culture:

Without delving too deeply into the mass of scholarly literature that has developed around this word, two inter-related definitions stand out. They are:

- The social production and transmission of identities, meanings, knowledge, beliefs, values, aspirations, memories, purposes, attitudes and understanding;
- 2. The 'way of life' of a particular set of humans: customs, faiths and conventions; codes of manners, dress, cuisine, language, arts, science, technology, religion and rituals; norms and regulations of behaviour, traditions and institutions.

So, culture is both the **medium and the message** – the inherent values and the means and the results of social expression. Culture enfolds every aspect of human intercourse; the family, the education, legal, political and transport systems, the mass media, work practices; welfare programs, leisure pursuits, religion, the built environment.

<u>Summary:</u> A society's values are the basis upon which all else is built. These values and the ways they are expressed are a society's culture...(Hawk,J 2001)

MAC Inc. Response

Liveability is a broad concept which includes a combination of a social, cultural, economic and environmental attributes of a place. (The four pillars of community sustainability). These attributes determine the attractiveness and health and wellbeing of a place for both residents and investors.

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Cultural attributes include the quantity, quality and diversity of the arts and cultural infrastructure, activities and services on offer. Accordingly they are the key elements of the attraction of a city or region as a place in which to "work, live and invest".

Access to and participation in cultural life is a fundamental right of individuals in all communities, and governments have a duty to create conditions for the full exercise of this right in accordance with Article 27 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (Hawks, J. 2001)

To further emphasise the above Moira Shire has experienced 3 natural disasters since 2012, namely Floods, Fires and a Tornado. Coupled with the effects of 10 years of drought, and subsequent changing of the agricultural landscape with the Irrigation Modernisation Project, high unemployment, higher than state average of cancer incidents, the highest obesity rate in the state and an aging population, leaves many in our communities vulnerable. They are experiencing the associated issues of social isolation, marginalisation, depression, and dementia

Two major studies, one from VicHealth (2002), the other by Dr Gene Cohen (2006) in America, provide well-documented evidence to suggest that creativity discovered through art as therapy can significantly assist individuals to form new relationships and, in turn, can exponentially boost individual wellbeing through community involvement. It makes future community cohesion and reconnection a real and achievable possibility.

There is increased competition, nationally and internationally, between cities and between regions to attract new residents and new businesses. Arts and culture can create a competitive economic advantage when linked with tourism and cultural tourism specifically by:

- creating or maintaining a unique and distinctive image for a city or region and
- Increasing the drawing power of a city or region to attract the so called "creative class" for a city or region.

Recent Victorian Government research indicates that up to two million Melbournians would consider a move to regional Victoria for lifestyle reasons where arts and culture are an important part of the community. Moira Shire needs to optimise this opportunity and to improve the liveability of Moira Shire residents. This is lacking in the current Council Draft Plan

Arts and culture contribute directly to the "sense of place" which attracts both residents and business. There is a merging between the attributes of a city or region that are seen by individuals as offering them a better quality of life, or liveability, and those attributes that are seen by investors or businesses as offering them competitive advantage, that is contributing to the city or regions competitiveness.(Deloittes.2007)

There is an abundance of research and an increasing body of evidence, both quantitative and qualitative on the positive contribution of arts and culture to a city's or regions liveability and health and wellbeing. Hence it adds to its competitive advantage. In particular, in regional centres, the presence of a diversified lifestyle and cultural choices is a key driver of high economic performance.

There is further evidence that regional cities in Victoria are also investing in cultural infrastructure and activities to create vibrant and diverse local cultural offerings attractive to

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new residents. Arts Victoria the Victorian Government arts development agency is currently pursuing policy initiatives in support of the contributions of arts and culture to liveability, health and wellbeing and competitiveness.

Synopsis.

This submission recommends that Moira Shire Council includes the following into the draft council plan2016 – 17.

- Include a cultural dimension integrated with social, economic and environmental elements of conceptual definition of liveability, health and wellbeing.
- Incorporate into any measure of liveability all four of the elements (social, economic, environmental and cultural) and the way in which these elements are related.
- 3. Note the evidence of the clear link between the contribution of arts and culture to liveability in particular to: health and wellbeing strategically positioning Moira as a centre for innovation and as a cultural tourism destination; and creating / maintain Moira communities as attractive to new residents, families and businesses.
- Note the contribution of arts and culture to high quality regional liveability health and wellbeing and economic development.

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
